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<sup>1</sup>ENG 1/ENG 2 & RDL 1/RDL 2 are no longer available. Students with ENG/RDL remedial needs will now enroll in corequisite course ENG 100 (If English Proficiency Index 0-49), **OR** ENG 110 (If English Proficiency Index is 50-64).

<sup>2</sup>MTH 1/MTH 5 are no longer available. Students with Math Proficiency Index of 59 **OR** lower may now enroll in corequisite course MTH 21.5 **OR** MTH 23.5. Students with 39 **OR** lower MPI are strongly encouraged to enroll in Math Start/CUNY Start.

<sup>3</sup>Students may select either a 4-credit STEM variant science course or a 3-credit science course to fulfill Required Core C. Students selecting a 3-credit course must also complete an additional 1-credit lab course to fulfill graduation requirements.

<sup>7</sup>The Modern Language Department will consider exemption requests for students who present appropriate evidence that they have completed full-time study at a college or university outside of the United States in which the language of instruction was other than English. These students will be exempted from a foreign language requirement at Bronx Community College.

<sup>8</sup>This requirement is satisfied if a student takes 4-credit STEM variant course in Required Area C.

<sup>9</sup>Consult with the department to discuss which courses apply towards teacher preparation to obtain certification to teach in the disciplines relevant to middle and high schools.
