## **Footnotes:**

<sup>1</sup>ENG 100/110/111 plus one course from ENG 112, 114, 115, and 116. It is recommended that students choose ENG 115.

<sup>2</sup>Students with English Proficiency Index (EPI) of 0-49 enroll in corequisite course ENG 100. Students with EPI of 50-64 enroll in corequisite course ENG 110. Students with EPI of at least 65 (or other English proficiency qualification) enroll in ENG 111. Students with ESL need should take appropriate ESL course(s) (Sequence: ESL 01->02->03->09) before enrolling in ENG 110.

<sup>3</sup>Students with Math Proficiency Index (MPI) of 59 **OR** lower enroll in corequisite course MTH 21.5 **OR** MTH 23.5. Students with Math Proficiency Index of 39 **OR** lower are strongly encouraged to enroll in Math Start/CUNY Start.

<sup>4</sup>Students may select either a 3-credit science course plus a lab course (1 cr.) or 4-credit STEM variant science course to fulfill Required Core C. Students selecting a 3-credit course in this area will have to take a 4-credit STEM variant science course in Flexible Area E in order to fulfill the lab requirement.

<sup>7</sup>For students who have also enrolled in ENG 110 as a corequisite course.

<sup>8</sup>World Language courses taught in English (e.g., ITL 123) do not satisfy this requirement.

<sup>9</sup>Some languages (e.g., French and Spanish) require placement testing prior to enrollment. Please contact the World Languages and Cultures Department for more information.

<sup>10</sup>The World Languages and Cultures Department will consider exemption requests for students who present appropriate evidence that they have completed full-time study at a college or university outside of the United States in which the language of instruction was other than English. These students will be exempted from a foreign language requirement at Bronx Community College.

<sup>11</sup>It is recommended that students use free elective credits to take MEDP 18. Select additional free electives in consultation with Media Studies advisor.

In order to apply for graduation, students must complete all required courses with appropriate grades, complete two writing intensive courses, and have a minimum GPA of 2.0.
